

Although its origins are difficult to determine, this tune is often played and has been adapted to many different styles. One thing for sure is that *Cripple Creek* is an old tune named after a stream located someplace between Georgia and Oregon! Adding a flattened seventh in a solo with many fast-moving notes gives the tune a hard-driving bluegrass sound.
